REPRESENTATIVES from approximately 20 large construction firms attended a Centrifuge Uranium Enrichment Proposal Conference on plantsite on Thursday, December 15. After a short bus tour of the proposed site, they were briefed on various aspects of the project by DOE personnel from the area office and Oak Ridge. The new centrifuge plant, estimated to cost between \$4.2 and \$4.5 billion in 1978 dollars, will add 8.8 million separative work units. Prospective contractors must submit their proposals by January 23, 1978

WILLIAM R. MILLER has become GT&R's Director, Governmental Personnel Relations. In his new position, Miller is responsible for ensuring corporate compliance with federal, state and local laws in EEO as well as OSHA areas. It also was announced that Dr. Clifford Johnson has been named Corporate Medical Director. Both men were formerly GAT employees.

A SPECIAL ONE-DAY BLOODMOBILE VISIT took place on plantsite on January 4, 1978. It was done to answer an urgent request from the Tri-State Red Cross as a result of recent large blood demands plus a critically low supply. Their hope was for a maximum of 120 donors. GAT employees responded generously as 178 pints were collected -- outstanding results for a 5½-hour Bloodmobile visit!!

THE DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY has extended for three years its contract with the National Lead Company of Ohio. Operating DOE's Feed Materials Production Center, the current annual operating cost is about \$19 million and employs approximately 615 people.

THE AVERAGE eight-hour-a-day job-holder has to work two hours and 42 minutes a day to pay his federal, state and local taxes. That adds up to four months and four days a year before you start working for yourself.

THE NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation has issued a Draft Environmental Statement (DES) on the environmental considerations associated with the application of Ohio Edison Company and four other utilities for permits to build the proposed two-unit Erie Nuclear Plant, in Erie County, Ohio. The site is about 55 miles southeast of Toledo and 34 miles west of Cleveland.

MAJOR CORPORATIONS are getting into the mail order business increasingly. The increased participation by larger corporations is due to the evident growth and profitability of the business. Additionally, technological developments such as home video recording and playback will be adding great impetus to in-home sales in future years.

U.S. MANUFACTURERS are flying highest in the fastest climbing world aircraft market. This is the field called "general aviation," which embraces non-military and non-airline equipment. Through September this year, U.S. firms produced 12,524 units, or 94 percent of all free world production. The U.S. projects 1977 shipments at \$1.4 billion, up 14 percent from the 1976 figure.

MANY PEOPLE have seen article after article telling how the federal government is taking care of us--excessively--at the expense of the taxpayer-consumer. "Don't drink the contents of your car battery!" That's what the Consumer Product Safety Commission requires auto battery manufacturers to tell consumers via a label attached to each battery built. The cost to consumers? A mere \$5 million a year!!
