Contract Awards

Dynamic Industrial Constructors, Inc., Dallas, was the apparent low bidder on a contract for Feed & Withdrawal Building internals for GCEP. The bid of \$42,116,000 was one of 11 received by DOE-PPO. Work consists of installation of interior architectural features, plumbing, HVAC equipment, ductwork, fire water risers and halon systems, piping, instruments and instrument lines, electrical equipment and systems, railroads and railroad siding, interior and exterior concrete, structural steel, process pipeway, site improvements and finish grading.

U. S. Engineering, Co., Kansas City, Missouri, was the apparent low bidder on a contract for decontamination processes for the Recycle/Assembly Building for GCEP. Its bid of \$3,628,569 was one of six received by DOE-PPO. Work under this contract consists of furnishing all labor, materials, tools, and equipment for performing work in the Recycle/Assembly Building.

The Sherman R. Smoot Co., Columbus, was the apparent low bidder on a contract for construction of a first phase of site improvements for GCEP. Its bid of \$5,737,000 was one of six received by DOE-PPO. The work will include site preparation and grading, roads and parking area, fencing and storm drainage.

Nationwide Roofing & Sheet Metal, Inc., Dayton, was the apparent low bidder on a contract for roof replacement and upgrading, X-342, X-600, X-611-C and X-705 for GDP. The bid of \$178,600 was one of 13 received by DOE-PPO. Work in the contract is to furnish all labor, materials and equipment required for tear-off and replacement or repair and resaturation of existing built-up roofing as well as related carpentry and sheet metal work.
