## Around the Portsmouth Plant

Any person encountering an emergency condition on plantsite should immediately alert Plant Emergency Response Teams by dialing 5555. It is each employee's responsibility to report an emergency, and then provide instructions and assistance as required. Emergency calls to 5555 include, but are not limited to, calls for fire, emergency trucks or ambulance service. Give your name and vital information to answering parties.

On May 29, as Rick Coriell and Bill Knauff -- both of GAT's Police Department (D-313) -- were on their way home after working night shift, they observed a swerving car with occupants appearing intoxicated and stopped at the Portsmouth State Highway Patrol Post to report the incident. Bob Dwyer, husband of Sharon Dwyer (D-441) and a State Highway Patrolman, was dispatched to locate the vehicle. Coriell and Knauff left the post and came upon the scene where Dwyer had stopped the motor vehicle north of Portsmouth. In an exchange of gunfire, Dwyer had been injured, but was still conscious and retaining one of the suspects. Sharon Dwyer notes that Coriell and Knauff quickly proved their courage and willingness to provide assistance by assisting her husband and helping to retain the suspect until deputies arrived.

## News from DOE

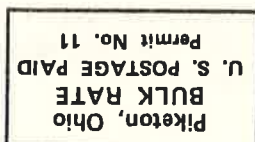
